
## New Farmgirl in Town!

## Nested Egg Toast

Preheat oven to 325°. Butter a slice of bread and place it on a cookie sheet or ovenproof skillet. Crack an egg and separate the white from the yolk. (Be careful not to break the yolk.) Whip the egg white until firm. On a plate, mold the white into a nest using a wet spoon. With a spatula, scoop the nest onto the buttered bread. Put the yolk into the nest and bake until the nest is golden brown and the yolk is set the way your child likes it.


