



## Featured Recipe

#### Farmgirl Salad (Yield: four servings)

1/2 cup fresh strawberries, sliced 1/2 cup almonds

small apple, thinly sliced 1/4 cup fresh cilantro, chopped

1/2 teaspoon lemon juice 2 cups mixed greens


Toss strawberries and apple with lemon juice. Add remaining ingredients. Drizzle with Garlic Almond Vinaigrette and toss.

#### Garlic Almond Vinaigrette (Yield: 2/3 cup)

1 small clove garlic, minced 1 tablespoon white wine vinegar

1/2 teaspoon sea salt2 teaspoons honey2 teaspoons almond butter1/2 cup olive oil

In a pint jar, blend all ingredients and shake the jar vigorously for 3 to 5 minutes. Store, tightly covered, in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.
